Advent: A Time of Reflection

As I prepare to observe a meaningful Advent, I once again reflect on the radical transformation of the heart that manifests itself at Grace Mission. One need only to listen during a Saturday morning Bible Studies or Tuesday evening praises and prayer service to experience on tool by the outpouring of broken people in a broken world but also to the unabashed expressions of repentance and love for Jesus that is largely absent from most maintline churches.
