





A Season of Angels

As I look forward to celebrating Thanksgiving I’m aware of the many blessings I have to be thankful for and the many ways God is at work in the children’s ministry of Grace Mission. We are ending the year with 50 children in the After-School Program at Springfield Apartments Public Housing Project, aka Joe Louis, and thirty-five on the waiting list clamoring to be a part of the program.

Many of these children and their families are unchurched, so I’m especially excited about the upcoming Advent/Christmas season’s opportunity to introduce them to church. Our Grace Mission tradition is to have our Family Christmas Celebration the Tuesday before Christmas Eve, so this year we will be gathering on Tuesday, December 17, at 5:30pm for Eucharist, a Christmas feast, and gift giving. Since we do not have space at Grace Mission for all these families, St. John’s Church is graciously allowing us to use their sanctuary for Eucharist and Alfriend Hall for the feast and gift giving. What a beautiful setting for the families to be introduced to the Eucharist and church. Can’t wait to see the expressions on the children’s faces as they enter that beautiful sanctuary!

We plan to have three gifts for each child in the program provided though angel trees at your churches. Please consider taking an angel and making a child’s wish come true. There will be one gift listed per angel and you may take one or more angels based on the number of gifts you’d like to provide. To help you budget and shop, many angels have specifics listed such as price, if the child selected the listed item from the Family Dollar Store Christmas Catalogue. You may substitute similar items from other stores. Please bring the gifts to your parish hall or to Grace Mission unwrapped in a gift bag and clearly marked with the child’s name by Wednesday, December 11, so we can organize everything in time for the family Christmas Celebration on the 17th. Entire families will be attending and we also will give one gift to each non-program sibling who comes with the family to the celebration. Those will be generic gifts matched by age and gender, not from wish lists or angels on the trees. Extra gifts we receive may be used for these siblings.

We need volunteers from December 11th to 14th to help get gifts ready for this celebration and others to serve on Tuesday,
