Dear sisters and brothers,

My time of ministry at Grace Mission has come to an end. It is with a heavy heart that I reflect back on the three-years of transformative and challenging ministry that God called me to live into here. In my privilege, I had always said, "Why, yes, I have a heart for ministry to the poor and the marginalized." There is a profound difference, my sisters and brothers, about having a heart for ministry at the edge and walking into that work. When Jesus talks with the disciples about putting their hands to the plow and not looking back with longing to their former lives, is just this living in the difference between pity and empathy.



Now, don't hear me wrong, I am no saint for having come to Grace Mission. In fact, I came here broken and in great pain. I came here not reconciled to the problems in my ministry and relationships. Here is the beauty of Grace Mission (and I'm not the only one who has experienced this) – Grace Mission is a place of grace and healing. It is a congregation that doesn't hide its brokenness; here are people in all their humanity without any façade. And at Grace Mission, everyone is welcome – not just to worship, not just for food, not just to fellowship. Here at Grace Mission, everyone is welcome to encounter God at work in the world and the God who is calling God's children back into the reconciled relationship that we knew once before in our own creation. This is what church can be, that sacred space where we are reconciled to ourselves, to our community, to our relationships, and also to God. So, when God called about Grace Mission, with trepidation and hubris, I said yes. And have been changed in such beautiful and wonderful ways and my ministry has been transformed. I too experienced Help, Healing, and Hope.

The first day I was on my own, way back there in 2016, it was my job to conduct the 12Steps@4:30 service and get people through the dinner line, I was pretty nervous; a congregation member who had lived and drank on the streets for years, said, "Pastor Jenni, God has this." Thanks, Don. Thanks, God. Again and again, in most wonderful and challenging and profound ways I have seen the power of God's creative Spirit, the peace and justice of Jesus Christ, and the reconciling call that God issues. I could fill pages with experiences however there are only a few column inches. I leave Grace Mission re-tuned, reconciled, and renewed for ministry in God's church. So thank you for the opportunity and the space. God will continue to bless the work that is going on and that is about to be born in this place where God encounters the world.
